You finished reading the story, **so** you know the ending.
3. James has an ear infection. He also coughs a lot. *(and)*
James has an ear infection, **and** he also coughs a lot.
4. Dad will stay home today. He will look after James. *(and)*
Dad will stay home today, **and** he will look after James.
5. Take off your boots. Hang up your coat. *(and)*
Take off your boots **and** hang up your coat.
6. Put away your toys. We will go to the store. *(so)*
Put away your toys, **so** we will go to the store.
7. Jolene is a good singer. She is so nervous. *(but)*
Jolene is a good singer, **but** she is so nervous.
8. Matt put his toy cars away. He forgot the red one. *(but)*
Matt put his toy cars away, **but** he forgot the red one.
