



Using a comma to connect clauses

Use a comma and conjunction to connect the sentences.

Commas can be used to connect two complete sentences, along with a conjunction such as “and”, “but”, “or”, and “so”.

We went shopping. Then we went to the pool.

We went shopping, and then we went to the pool.

Answers

The monkey pulled the fire alarm, **so** all the firefighters came.
3. The octopus slid down the slide. The lion went on the swings.
The octopus slid down the slide, **and** the lion went on the swings.
4. The alien was excited to go to the movies. He thought it was very scary.
The alien was excited to go to the movies, **but** he thought it was very scary.
5. Do you want to have breakfast for dinner? Would you rather have dessert for breakfast?
Do you want to have breakfast for dinner, **or** would you rather have dessert for breakfast?
