Grade 1 Reading Worksheet



The **plot** is what happens in a story, from the beginning all the way to the end. It usually includes a **problem** and a **solution**!

A **problem** is what goes wrong in the story.

A **solution** is how the problem is fixed or solved.

1. Read or listen to the story.

One sunny afternoon, Liam and his mom were driving to the park when their car started making a funny noise. Liam's mom pulled over to the side of the road.

"Oh no," she said. "We have a flat tire!" Liam looked out the window and saw one of the tires was squished and flat.

"We can't drive like this," his mom said. "We need to change the tire." She got the spare tire and tools from the trunk, but the tire was heavy.

"I can help hold it while you put it on," Liam said.

Together, they took off the flat tire and put the new one on. It took a little while, but soon the car was ready to go. Liam and his mom gave each other a high five and got back on the road.

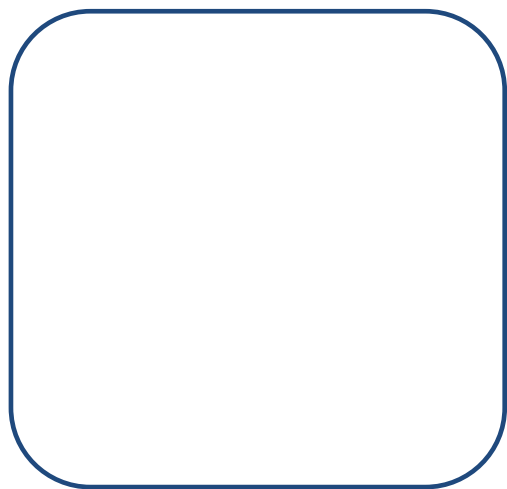
"We make a good team!" Liam said as they drove to the park.



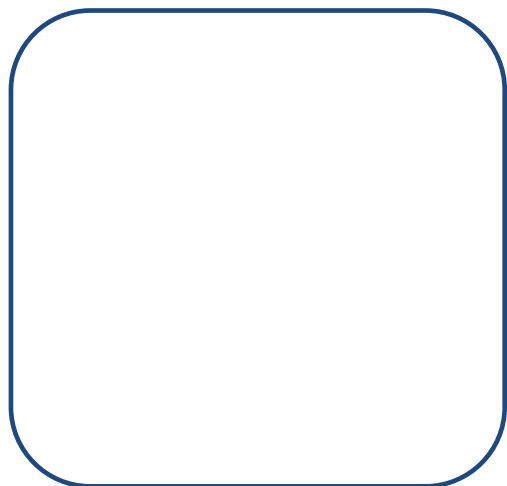


2. Fill in the boxes with pictures and words to describe the story's problem and solution.
