Grade 2 Comprehension Worksheet

The **plot** is all the action that happens in a story, from the beginning all the way to the end.

It usually includes a **problem** and a **solution**!

A **problem** is what goes wrong in the story.

A **solution** is how the problem is fixed or solved.

Read the story.

Every morning, Julia feeds her pet bunny, Buster, after she eats breakfast. Buster always gets excited to see her. He hops in circles around his cage because he loves to eat!

This morning, Julia went over to say hi to Buster before feeding him. Like always, he got excited and started hopping in circles around his cage.



When Julia reached for the food, she realized there wasn't any left. Not even a few little pieces! "Oh no!" she thought. "What am I going to do? Buster is hungry and thinks it's time to eat!"

Then Julia had an idea. Her family ate a big salad for dinner last night! She was pretty sure there were still leftovers. Julia opened the fridge and found the lettuce, carrots and cucumbers.

"Here you go!" she said, putting the vegetables into his cage. Buster's eyes got big when he saw the new food. He hopped over and happily ate his breakfast!
