Hint:

*When a sentence begins with yes, no, or sure, it is followed by a **comma**.*

Yes, I can come.

Answers

Sure, we would like to sleep in late.

Answers will vary. Here are examples of correct answers:

5. Do you play soccer in the summer?
No, I play baseball instead.
6. Would you pass me the butter?
Sure, it would be my pleasure.
