“**Will**” is used for an action in the future:

Jane will go to the store tomorrow.

“**Would**” is used when an action may happen if something else happens:

Jane would go to the store if she had time.

“**Would**” can also be the past tense of will:

Yesterday, Jane said she would go to the store today.
