Grade 2 Comprehension Worksheet

The **setting** is where the story takes place. Sometimes, the author tells you the setting. Sometimes, you have to use clues from the story to guess the setting.

Read the story and think about setting:

Ella and her mom walked into the big, quiet room. The air felt warm and smelled like old paper. Tall shelves filled with books in every color and size stood all around. People sat at tables reading quietly in one part of the room. In another part, people waited in line to check out their books.

Ella loved it here. It was her favorite place to find new stories. She smiled when she saw the children's section around the corner. There were small bean bag chairs on the floor, and someone was reading a book aloud for Story Time!

Ella walked to the picture books. She flipped through them, looking for one to read. She picked one about a baby bird learning to fly. It reminded her of the birds she saw outside her window at home.

She plopped down on a bean bag chair and started reading. The first page made her giggle because the baby bird was so silly. She couldn't wait to see if the bird would learn to fly by the end!
