Answers

1. We could walk to the park. We could go swimming. (*or*)
We could walk to the park, **or** we could go swimming.
2. Fanny enjoys baking. There is no flour left. (*but*)
Fanny enjoys baking, **but** there is no flour left.
3. They play with trucks. They put their toys away. (*and*)
They play with trucks, and they put their toys away.
4. Linda wrote her name on the sheet. She answered the first question. (*and*)
Linda wrote her name on the sheet, and she answered the first question.
5. Jeremy wanted to play baseball. It started raining. (*but*)
Jeremy wanted to play baseball, **but** it started raining.
6. Do you want waffles? Do you prefer pancakes? (*or*)
Do you want waffles, **or** do you prefer pancakes?
