(or)
Next summer, we could visit Florida, **or** we could go to the Grand Canyon.
5. Melanie bought cookies at the store. She put them away in the cupboard. *(and)*
Melanie bought cookies at the store, **and** she put them away in the cupboard.
6. My uncle would like to fly planes. He is afraid of heights. *(but)*
My uncle would like to fly planes, **but** he is afraid of heights.
