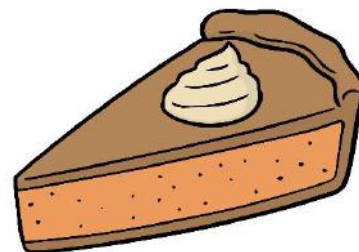
Underline the nouns and pronouns that each pronoun in bold refers to.
